

TBRI® Practitioner Application: Frequently Asked Questions

1. Q: Can you please provide me with specific feedback on why my application was not accepted?

A: We wish we could consult with each individual who has questions about why their application was not accepted, but unfortunately we are unable to do this. We are a small team and evaluate each applicant individually while also looking at each application pool as a whole.

We encourage anyone who has not been accepted to apply again! Because of the volume of applications we receive, we unfortunately must turn away qualified candidates for every training session, and most individuals who are accepted have applied more than once. We strongly recommend that you use the same e-mail address if you apply multiple times so we can have your application record in one place. We make every effort to place individuals who have shown consistency in applying and dedication to becoming a TBRI® Practitioner.

2. Q: What qualifications are you looking for in applicants? What skills, education, or training must I have to be accepted?

A: Our biggest goal for TBRI Practitioner Training is to equip professionals serving multiple individuals and families across many geographic regions and systems of care. This way we can maximize the impact of our training sessions to reach more individuals and continue in our mission: “To bring hope and healing to children around the world.” For this reason, we prioritize admitting individuals who are using TBRI® professionally.
